### **Caring for the Environment**

Catholics believe that the whole of creation is God's gift and is holy because it comes from God. There is nothing in creation that should be rejected or neglected.

"In Judaeo-Christian tradition the word 'creation' has a broader meaning than 'nature', for it has to do with God's loving plan in which every creature has its own value and significance. Nature is usually seen as a system which can be studied, understood and controlled, whereas creation can only be understood as a gift from the outstretched hand of the Father of all, and as a reality illuminated by the love which calls us together into universal communion".

When Jesus was asked which was the greatest commandment he said: "The first is, Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God is one; you shall love your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength'. The second is this, you shall love your neighbour as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these". Mark 12:29-31

### How Catholics care for the environment

One of the ways Christians show their love for God is by valuing what God has created. They do this by taking care of the world and not abusing the environment in any way. There is a delicate balance within creation and if one element is damaged the other is too.

The second commandment is to love your neighbour and one of the most important ways believers can do this is by caring for the environment where their neighbour lives. If one person does not care about issues like pollution, littering and so on, they are not just affecting their own lives but the lives of everyone else as well, including future generations.

All Catholics should be aware of how their actions today might affect the world in centuries to come. An example of this is being aware of how pollution or the exploitation of limited natural resources will damage the lifestyles of future generations.


However just thinking about these issues is not enough. If the thinking does not lead to action then such thinking is pointless. Catholics must not allow themselves to become hypocrites in the regard. Words should turn into action to care for the environment without doing the same themselves. E.g. In 2008 the Vatican installed thousands of solar panels.

### Sustainability

Sustainability is the ability of the whole world to carry on working in the right balance. It is the acceptance that humans need a healthy, self-perpetuating environment for all life to prosper. Most international organisations like the United Nations, now accept that humans cannot simply use and abuse the world for their own immediate advantage. Pollution, deforestation and overpopulation are just a few of the problems that have contributed to an imbalance in the world's ecology.







































### **CAFOD**

Pope Francis calls for a 'bottom-up' approach to caring for the world that puts the poorest and their needs at the centre of world politics and economies. Improving the lives of the poorest in the world, to create a balance and sustainability. He also believes there is a need for people to listen to each other and this includes a recognition that developing countries are often good sources of sustainable techniques, such as farming methods that don't exhaust the soil and fishing methods that don't deplete the number of fish in the sea.

CAFOD is the official agency for the Catholic Church in England and Wales and its main aim is to help the poorest people in the world. They do this by:

- Encouraging people to live more simply, so that natural resources are not used too quickly.
- Supporting and setting up projects which recognise that humans, resources and the environment are all important and interrelated; CAFOD helps all of its partners to ensure that their projects protect the environment.
- Working with other international organisations to ensure that sustainability is one of the leading approaches to national and international politics and trade.
- Helping to found the Beyond 2015 campaign, which supported the creation of the UN Sustainability
  Development Goals in 2015; these seek to protect the environment and improve people's quality of
  life by 2030, partly through the use of sustainable projects throughout the world.
- Working with groups like MONLAR in Sri Lanka, which helps farmers to use sustainable techniques that are economical yet effective, such as natural fertilisers.






