

Star Athletes: Jessie's Story

This week our featured Year 7 athlete is Jessie, a footballer signed to Manchester City! Jessie's story began when she joined Liverpool Feds, based in Jericho Lane, aged about five. She stayed for many happy seasons there developing her skills until a trial for Wigan Athletic when she was ten. Jessie was successful at trial and joined Wigan Athletic for a season before one of her former coaches recommended her to the attention of Stoke City whom she then switched to. Things at Stoke weren't to last long, as Jessie undertook a trial for Manchester City which proved to be successful and she now plays under contract at the Etihad complex. Weekend training is intensive and, as Jessie explains, doesn't begin on the pitch: "At the weekend the session starts in the classroom with a detailed brief on what the training session hopes to achieve. Then we get a great lunch!" Monday sees a two hour physical session, and the Tuesday is match day competing against local teams who are usually boys' teams. Jessie did play in a tournament in the summer against her equivalent teams at Chelsea and Arsenal which was a great experience. There are bonuses too - when the City Women's Team play their WSL matches at home Jessie and her team mates get to mascot and take on pitchside duties. We're looking forward to keeping you posted on her progress.





Hub Of Hope

The Hub of Hope is the UK's leading mental health support database. It is provided by national mental health charity, Chasing the Stigma, and brings local, national, peer, community, charity, private and NHS mental health support and services together in one place for the first time.

Parent Chat Live

Action for Children Parent Chat is a free and confidential live chat with a qualified parenting coach in the UK. Staff are there to talk about family life, caring for children or managing your wellbeing as a parent. The chat service is a safe space for a parent to share their concerns. There will be someone to listen, take time to understand a parent's situation, and work with the parent

to find possible solutions. If appropriate, they may suggest ideas for where to get extra support.

Liverpool Citizens Support Scheme

If you find yourself in crisis you can apply for support to get food and basic necessities for you and your family including gas and electric vouchers (urgent needs) and furniture and household essentials (home needs).

An emergency or crisis might be a fire or flood, or you have had to move due to violence or fear of violence, or you are leaving care or prison and need support to stay in the community. There are more details available here.

Domestic Abuse:

There is clear evidence that nationally and locally the frequency of incidences of domestic abuse increased during and following the pandemic. If you or someone you know is suffering from domestic abuse then the following resources will be of use:

- Merseyside Police provide a range of <u>local and national</u> <u>helplines</u>, including a vital resource for adults <u>'#lt's</u> <u>abuse'</u>.
- The <u>Bright Sky app</u> is an excellent resource for victims of domestic abuse.
- The <u>Hideout</u> resources provide support for children who have witnessed or suffered from domestic abuse
