End of Year Reports

All students will receive their end of year report. This will be

published in July and will include information on student's academic progress from September 2019 to March 2020. Students will also be commended on any work completed during lockdown. It will not be possible to issue operational grades at this point but baseline assessments will take place in September to identify strengths and any gaps in knowledge and understanding. Year 10 students will receive their mock results in their end of year reports. All curriculum teams have adjusted their curriculum maps to ensure that retrieval and re-connection techniques are used to support student progress.
